**A LENTEN THOUGHT**

Lent. Prayer and Penance. These two aspects of this holy season can be combined into one powerful action. Resolve to give up one hour a week of television or some other activity. Replace it with a holy hour before Jesus, exposed in the Blessed Sacrament. Ask Jesus in prayer if this is what He wants of you this season of Lent. Choose any day of the week. Choose a particular hour of the day whether during the day or during the night. Then call the rectory to sign up for the six weeks of Lent. It will truly be a life changing move.

**40 DAYS FOR LIFE**

40 Days for Life coincides with the holy season of Lent. This is 40 days of prayer and fasting to end abortion. It is 40 days of peaceful, prayerful vigil outside of Planned Parenthood. It is 40 days of pro-life witnessing. In this season of prayer and fasting it is fitting that we would use our efforts to beg God's mercy to spare the babies in danger of being aborted.

As a parish we will join in this effort. You are encouraged to offer prayers, holy hours and fasting for the success of this campaign. For each of the 40 days there will be a peaceful picketing of Planned Parenthood on Coates Drive in Goshen. It will be from 7AM to 6PM.

## FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this passage, Job laments the drudgery and pain all people sometimes experience in life. He talks of troubled days and restless nights. But he does mention that the days move along swiftly, which can remind us that our time here on earth is quite limited and should be well spent.

### Second Reading: I Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul explains to the Corinthians that he has no choice, but must preach the gospel. He tells of making himself all things to all people, in order to save some of them. He reminds them that he does this willingly, in the hope of sharing in the blessings of the gospel.

### Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon and Andrew's mother of a fever, then others with illnesses or demons came to see him. He cured those who were ill, and cast out the demons of the others. Then he went off and prayed alone until his followers sought him out. Jesus and his disciples then moved on to other villages to proclaim the good news.

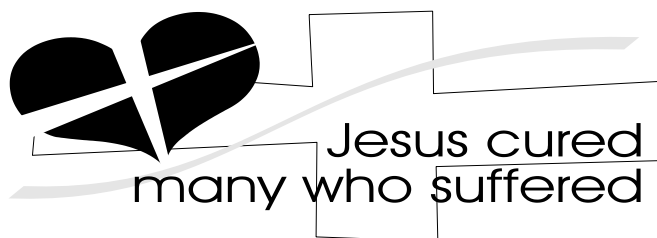

## ST. JOSEPH'S PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held their monthly meeting on Tuesday, January 18<sup>th</sup>. It was the first meeting since November as the Parish council does not meet in December because of Christmas.

In the Pastor's Report, Father Dennis mentioned many important things that are going on since the last meeting. He announced the elevation of Archbishop Dolan to Cardinal and explained that information and prices for those wanting to travel to Rome to see the ceremony was available in the Parish office.

Father Dennis spoke about how beautiful the season of Advent and Christmas were. With opportunities to grow in spirituality like the Advent Holy Hour, the Taize Prayer Service and Reconciliation Monday, parishioners and visitors had a chance to prepare themselves for Christmas. Father thanked the Altar Rosary Society for decorating the Altars for Christmas and for the great success in the annual Christmas Flower collection. Father suggested a similar Flower Collection be made at Easter time with envelopes that parishioners can use to dedicate donations in memory of deceased relatives. Father also said that many were still commenting on how beautiful the Christmas Masses were this year, especially the Children's Mass coordinated by Mrs. Angelica Frausto, our Religious Education Coordinator, and the Midnight Mass, which was spectacular as always.

Father Dennis announced a parish social which should be held in the spring. We had a parish social several years ago to get parishioners together. Although the turnout was successful, we hadn't had one since. The event will be offered free of cost but parishioners will be asked to RSVP to the rectory so that we know how many people to expect. Father also said we would need volunteers to help coordinate the event and perhaps prepare platters of finger foods.

Father also announced a proposal that the church and chapel be repainted and restored. Mr. Pierce, a church artist and consultant, will give a proposal to the parish this Sunday (Feb 5) after the 11:30 am Mass. All are welcome to come and see what the church could look like if restored.

Father also mentioned there were many positive reactions to the new Mass Schedule. Finally Father gave an update on Father George Valastro, Monsignor has returned home to the rectory as he has completed the course of physical therapy ahead of schedule. He will continue physical therapy at Orange Regional Medical Center as needed. The next meeting will be held in mid February.
